Holiday Office Hours – Community Offices will be closed on Friday, July 4th in observance of Independence Day. We will re-open at 8AM, Monday, July 7th. If you have an urgent, or emergency maintenance related issue, please call (252) 501-2511.

Community Pool Reminders – Pools close hourly for 15 minutes to allow lifeguards to check chemicals, take a short break to cool off, and stay hydrated. If any foreign substances enter the pool, it is required to close for a minimum of 90 minutes to ensure all safety protocols are followed and proper cleaning has been completed. Pools will close for 30 minutes in the event of inclement weather when thunder and/or lightning is seen or heard. Should thunder or lightning occur within 30 minutes, for the safety of our families and team members, the pool will remain closed for an additional 30 minutes after hearing or seeing.

Residents moving in or preparing to PCS should be aware of bulk trash procedures:

- Set bulk trash next to waste receptacles on scheduled trash days.
- Items must be under 6 feet, and under 250 lbs.; appliances and mattresses are not allowed.
- Empty moving boxes should be broken down and placed in recycling or stacked beside the receptacle.
- Place trash receptacles at the curb the night before and return them after pickup.

Avoid placing trash around installation dumpsters; consider donating gently used items to local thrift stores.

DEMOLITION OF HURRICANE FLORENCE DAMAGED HOMES

As part of ongoing efforts to enhance and improve our community, demolition on some of the severely damaged homes in Nugent Cove and Grants Landing began on June 25th. This project is anticipated to take about 2 months to complete, pending any weather delays. The safety of our residents is our top priority. If you live or are visiting either of the areas where work is being completed, we kindly ask that for your safety that you do not enter any of the fenced off safety zones. Please keep all children away from these areas and any machinery or equipment that is on site.

SAFETY TIPS

To prevent fires and ensure home safety, follow these tips:

- **Smoke Alarms:** Never remove detectors; test monthly and replace batteries annually.
- In the Kitchen: Keep ovens clean and never leave cooking unattended.
- **Fire Extinguishers:** Keep them accessible, especially in the kitchen and garage; know the PASS method for use.
- Flammable Materials: Store safely in well-ventilated areas, away from heat sources.
- Dryer Vents: Clean regularly to avoid lint buildup.

MAINTENANCE TIPS

Excessive summer heat poses challenges for air conditioning units. They may struggle to meet cooling demands and can freeze, leading to failures. Air conditioners typically lower indoor air temperature by about 20 degrees, but extreme heat may prevent achieving the desired thermostat setting.

Factors such as dirty or frozen cooling coils, low refrigerant, and poor airflow can reduce cooling capacity. To prevent these issues, it is essential to change air filters monthly and check with your community office for filter availability.
